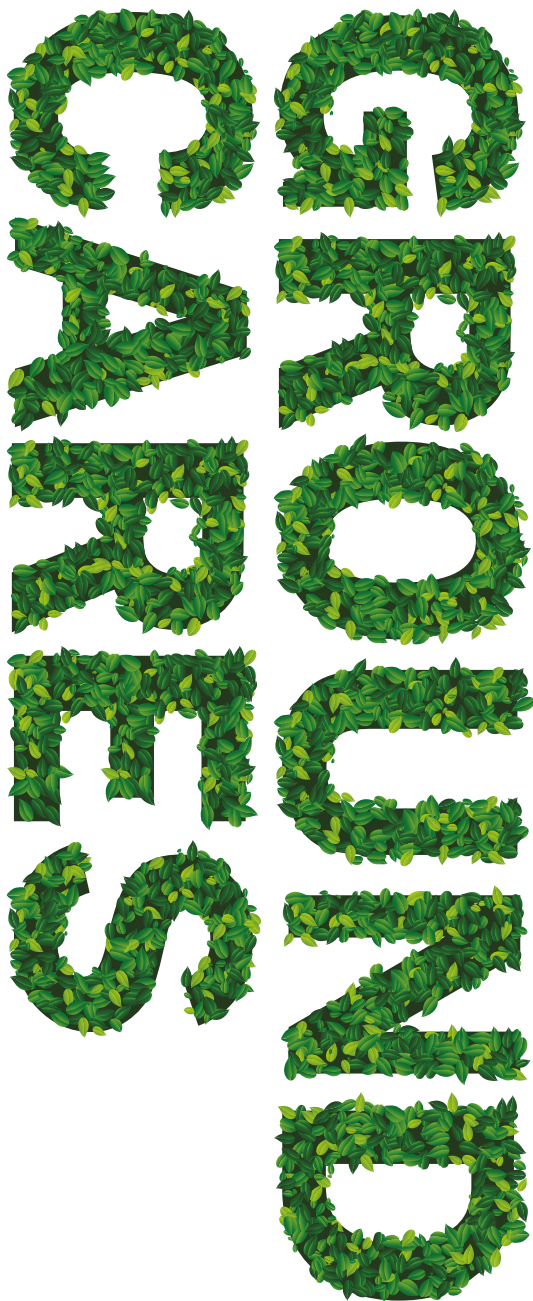


It's time to get serious about sustainability
